Dear brothers and sisters,

If you are ever discouraged by your own failures in Christian living take heart. We are no worse than the disciples of Jesus who were with him on the road to Jerusalem. The fact that they misunderstand Jesus continuously is a major theme of Mark's Gospel. They accept that Jesus is the Messiah but they cannot take in what he says about his suffering and death. They are wedded to the conventional idea of a glorious political ruler. This is behind the request of the sons of Zebedee, James and John in today's Gospel, (Mk 10:35-45). They have ambition for prime seats at his right and left at the banquet of the messianic kingdom.

In reply, Jesus uses biblical imagery to hint at what lies in store. 'Baptism' is not the Christian sacrament but a metaphor for trials imagined as a passage through turbulent waters. Likewise, 'cup' is a biblical metaphor for the fate that lies ahead of a person: what he or she will receive from the hand of God (cf. Mark 14:36). Without realising what they are letting themselves in for, James and John express their readiness to share Jesus' 'cup'. Jesus is surrendering his future entirely into the hands of the God in whose power and generosity he places complete trust. Those who wish to be his associates must accompany him in this trust as well. The other disciples who are also ambitious are furious with James and John. Jesus explains that 'the Son of Man has come, not to be served, but to serve and give his life as a ransom for many' (v 45). 'For many' in Semitic idiom means 'for all'. The 'service' Jesus performs is not just for Israel or for Catholics but for the entire world.

Today Jesus confronts the Church regarding the exercise of power and authority. Both have proven difficult areas throughout history. The Plenary Council of the Church in Australia is an attempt to change the way we are together as Christians by including as many voices as possible. So, prayer, reflection, listening and learning are fundamental to discerning what God is asking of us now. After an intense week of meetings the Plenary Council will reflect further and allow what they have heard to mature and then come back for a meeting next year. 
