Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's readings target unworthy religious leaders. In the end they stress that all members of the covenant people are equal, as children under the Fatherhood of God. As St John Paull II testified, what we share in baptism is so much more important that what differentiates us through ordination. This is being given greater prominence these days through the involvement of laity and religious in the Synod in Rome as it did during the Australian Plenary Council.

The **First Reading** is from the Book of Malachi, written after the return from the Babylonian exile when the people began to rebuild the Temple. Malachi warns the Temple priests (Mal 1:14–2:2, 8-10) that their corrupt behaviour is a breach of their responsibilities to God and to the people. For Israelites to break faith with each other is also breaking faith with God. Worth noting is that God is called 'Father', unusual in the Old Testament.

The **Gospel** (Matt23:1-12) comes from the last days of Jesus in Jerusalem. He warns against the pride and venality of the scribes and Pharisees. In contrast Matthew presents Jesus as the authentic interpreter of the Law of Moses (the Torah). The scribes and Pharisees instead of making the Law life-enhancing make it burdensome and crushing so as to enhance their own power. They lay burdens upon an already burdened people. Jesus, however, comes to lift the burdens of afflicted humanity: 'Come to me, all you who are weary and carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am meek and humble in heart, and you will find rest for you souls' (Matt 11:28-29).

Jesus sets the pattern for Christian leadership. He tells us since all are equal there is no place for honorific titles and practices that might suggest otherwise. Jesus came 'not to be served, but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many' (20:28); the 'greatest', therefore, must be 'your servant'. With the widespread exposure of clerical abuse and the failure of church authorities to handle it effectively and responsibly, has the time come to revisit the values and teaching enshrined here?
