Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's **Gospel** (Matt 25:1-13) features the Wise and Foolish Bridesmaids. It is not that easy to interpret as we don't know with certainty the wedding customs of the time but it seems improbable that it is OK for young women to go out to buy oil at midnight. It is helpful to see the parable as an allegory of life in the Church during the time of waiting for the return of its Lord (the 'Bridegroom').

The five wise and five foolish bridesmaids represent members of the Church, who are of mixed quality. The oil represents the kind of good deeds that Jesus commends – 'justice, mercy and faith' (23:23) – and which will be so graphically illustrated in the concluding parable of the Great Judgment (25:31-46). The five foolish bridesmaids represent those who cry out, 'Lord, Lord' but have no good works to accompany this confession of faith (7:21-27). The wise may 'sleep' (in death) before the coming of the Lord but when he does come, they will go out to meet him with the 'lamps' of their good works shining (cf. 5:16). The moral is 'Be prepared'.

The wise young women are prepared for the long haul. They have a clear priority to be there and ready whenever the bridegroom comes. Their wisdom is not from studying obscure knowledge but is grounded in a relationship of love. It is not something we possess but something that comes to us. Wisdom is another name for God. We don't seek God as much as, out of love, God seeks us. We need to be open, to "allow ourselves to be loved" (St Elisabeth of the Trinity). Wisdom and love grow together.

Understood this way the parable reminds us that the words of dismissal at the Eucharist, 'Go in peace to love and serve the Lord'. We need to train so that we will be fit to enter the kingdom of God by exercising generosity, forgiveness, hospitality, with their fruits of steadfast love, justice, and righteousness. Those who live with love of God and neighbour have the 'oil' required for salvation; so, they can 'sleep' peacefully without being anxious about the Lord's arrival.—*Blessings, Greg*
