

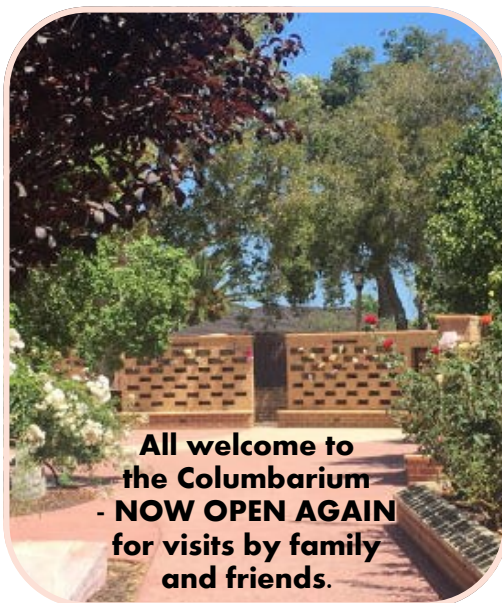
Dear sisters and brothers,

In nature, human history and in our own lives, good things emerge from small and inauspicious beginnings. So, it is with the reign of God. "O God, strength of those who hope in you, graciously hear our pleas, and, since without you mortal frailty can do nothing, grant us always the help of your grace, that in following your commands we may please you by our resolve and our deeds." This is the Collect for the 11th Sunday of the Year. We ask for the grace to freely want whatever God commands and to put it into action. This is in contrast to the constant pull to lies, rivalry, domination, greed and violence which mark the reign of Satan whose dark shadow we see in the world. May God be the source of the courage and strength we need

Faithful Jews of the time of Jesus interpreted prophecies in Isaiah 40-66 as pointing to a coming intervention of God that would do away with corruption and replace it with a liberating reign of God. An ideal ruler ('the Messiah'), would free God's people from foreign domination, and establish a messianic era of righteousness, prosperity and peace. This hope of political freedom and economic prosperity was what touched people when they heard Jesus speak and act. But for Jesus the heart of the Kingdom was renewed relationship with God marked by an unconditional offer of forgiveness and familial intimacy with God ('Our Father'). While the fullness of the Reign of God was in the future even now people could enter the Reign of God through believing the 'good news', changing how they lived and faith. These differences of understanding and expectations of the reign of God are behind the parables of Jesus.

So in the parable of the farmer who plants seed and then leaves it to grow without interference from him Jesus tells us that the reign of God has its own hidden inner dynamic. We don't need to fix it but we need patience and trust in God. All will be harvested in God's good time. The parable of the mustard seed tells us that just because something begins small it can grow, be fruitful and give life to those around it. Once more we are called to hope and trust in the effectiveness of God's reign. Believing in the love and mercy of God we can join with Julian of Norwich: "All shall be well, and all shall be well and all manner of thing shall be well."

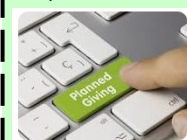
NEW PLANNED GIVING CAMPAIGN 2024 - 2025

Our planned giving membership campaign for 2024/25 has commenced and we ask each of you to please continue, or consider joining, this most important parish program.
