### The Collect Prayer

Grant, O Lord, that we may always revere and love your holy name, for you never deprive of your guidance those you set firm on the foundation of your love. Given that God never abandons us and his love sustains us, who are we? God's love and mercy is the heart of our identity, our worship, the source and inspiration of our wisdom, and the impulse that moves us to help build the reign of God.

# Today's Readings

In today's First Reading Job 38: 1, 8-11 Job has questioned God who brought life out of the uncontrolled chaos and destruction of wild water. In the imagination of the ancients only God can do this. This sets up our Gospel today (Mk4:35-41) in the midst of the storm which risks bringing the fishermen to a watery grave Jesus is unconcerned, taking a nap using the steersman's cushion as a pillow. They panic and wake Jesus. He stands and, in a God-like manner, calms the elements. The disciples are amazed and overwhelmed. They thought they knew Jesus, but they did not understand him or his mission.

For all the signs and wonders Jesus worked in healing the sick, reconciling those who were enemies, bringing forgiveness, welcoming home those who had been excluded and bringing sight to the blind the disciples do not understand who Jesus is. They see a miracle worker and don't see who the signs reveal Jesus to be. He was sent by the Father to enter deeply into human reality in all its messiness and to become a victim of the heartless powers that be. Their faith is without deep foundations. They don't really know Jesus.

The boat on the storm-tossed lake is often interpreted as the Church. Following Jesus in the Church today means being vulnerable in the face of dissension, rivalry and crisis in the world. We are called to know and grow in trust in Jesus and in our communion with the Church as it is. We are called to feel the pain of others and to respond with practical love and mercy. The Lord sets us free from fear and leads us on a journey of ever deeper faith, hope and love. We are pilgrims who know and trust Jesus, are united to him and allow ourselves to be guided by him. And so, we share God's peace and mercy to calm the storms around us today.

# Why celebrate the Eucharist?

In June 2022 Pope Francis wrote a letter on the Eucharist (Desiderio desideravi) which begins with Jesus' words "I have greatly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer" (Lk 22:15). Today Jesus earnestly desires to share the Eucharist with us. He personally invites us. What comes to your mind when we reflect on this personal invitation from Jesus?
