Dear sisters and brothers,

Collect

O God, who through the grace of adoption chose us to be children of light, grant, we pray, that we may not be wrapped in the darkness of error but always be seen to stand in the bright light of truth. This prayer is from the ancient Ambrosian Rite in Milan. We are God's children called to live in the light. It evokes the great acts of God: creation, the incarnation, the resurrection, the sending of the Spirit and baptism. To forget our identity as God's children is to be enveloped by darkness, loss of direction and of hope.

Readings

The **First Reading** (Wis 1:13-15; 2:23-24) insists that all human beings have been created to share eternal life with God. Death does not come from God but from the envy of a fallen angel who tricks human people into sin thereby making them subject to mortality. God's will is to share eternal life with human beings. By raising Jesus from the dead God shows that physical death does not have the last word. In the Gospel we have two miracle stories about women. In the first Jesus brings Jairus's daughter back to life.

The second story concerns the woman with a haemorrhage who due to her physical condition is ritually unclean and thereby socially excluded. With faith and hope she touches the clothing of Jesus who feels power go out from him. Amid the jostling crowds he asks who touched him. She is already healed but Jesus wants to make this public so that she can be restored to her family and community. He takes away her shame.

Paul's appeal for generosity in the Second Reading (2 Corinthians 8:7,9, 13-15) contains a beautiful reflection on the Incarnation of Christ in terms of richness and poverty. Jesus is God's supreme gift and we are urged to imitate his generosity in our giving. Jesus' action in bringing renewed life to Jairus' daughter and the woman with the haemorrhage is pure gratuitous gift. How we can be gift to others?

Inclusive Language in the Liturgy

The Australian Catholic Bishops Commission for Liturgy this month released a Statement of Principles: Language and the Liturgy. The major conclusions are:

- Inclusive language in the Church's liturgy is essential. Our words: demonstrate respect for the dignity of each person as a child of God; ensure that each person hears the texts as being addressed to them; and facilitate the full, conscious and active participation of all those gathered.
- Consequently, all new and revised liturgical books need to use accurate and inclusive language, though the processes of approval of liturgical books must be respected.
- Inclusive language is always to be used in general intercessions, in preaching, and in introductory remarks. Blessings, - Fr Greg
