Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's Collect: O God, protector of those who hope in you, without whom nothing has firm foundation, nothing is holy, bestow in abundance your mercy upon us and grant that, with you as our ruler and guide, we may use the good things that pass in such a way as to hold fast even now to those that ever endure. This prayer, written by Pope Vigilius, dates from 537 and gives thanks for the deliverance of Rome from a barbarian siege. God is felt as being intimately close to the community, offering continuous protection, guidance and leadership. Even in the midst of calamity, God is with us- close, merciful and abundant. We can trust him, constant in prayer remaining strong in the midst of crisis.

Today's **Gospel** begins a series of five Sundays from the 6th chapter of John's Gospel. It starts with the story of the multiplication of the loaves and fishes (Jn 6:1-15). In the first half of John's Gospel a sign (miracle) is followed by a long discourse unpacking the meaning of the sign. The theme of the discourse is that Jesus is the Bread of Life. The reference is to the Jewish feast of Passover celebrating the liberation of the Hebrew slaves from Egypt and their formation through the covenant into the people of God.

Seated on a mountain in front of the crowds, Jesus challenges his disciples with the question, 'Where can we buy bread?' Clearly it is impossible, in the middle of nowhere, to buy enough even if they had enough money. Jesus tells them to have the people sit down upon the green grass. The Greek word translated 'sit down' has the sense of 'recline as if for a banquet'. This creates the expectation of being fed well. The disciples are understandably anxious. They will look like fools telling people to get ready for a banquet in an isolated place far from shops and resources. For Jesus it is not a question of 'buying' anything but rather of becoming instruments of the divine generosity.

Feeding the 5,000 is sign, like the manna from heaven in Exodus where God sustained his people who were lost in the desert after fleeing Egypt. Jesus is the true Bread of Life come down from heaven to feed a hungry people now and always. He feeds a huge crowd with just five barley loaves and two fish.

Where Jesus is, there is abundance. With the Spirit of Jesus, how well do we perceive and meet the needs of others? The 12 baskets of leftovers can be seen as a symbol of the Eucharist by which Jesus continues to feed his people. The eucharistic celebration continues his revelation of the generous hospitality of God. The Eucharist feeds us with Christ, the Bread of Life and challenges us to be generous in response to the lost and hungry of our time.






