Dear sisters and brothers,

The Oration God of might, giver of every good gift, put into our hearts the love of your name, so that, by deepening our sense of reverence, you may nurture in us what is good and, by your watchful care, keep safe what you have nurtured. The heart of this prayer is that God plant deep in our hearts the gift of love of the divine name (i.e. the reality of God's self-revelation). We seek an increase of our reverence for God who nurtures and empowers us to live with heartfelt love and service of others and all creation.

God guides our feet along our way in life through his light (aka the Torah, the Law). Our **First Reading** (Deut 4:1-2. 6-8) tells us "By faithfully obeying these commands, you will show other nations how wise and understanding you are." There is no heaviness in God's law. God wants us to know him and to be his people. This loving relationship broadens our horizons and empowers us to "come to the help of orphans and widows when they need it" as our **Second Reading** (Jas 1:17-18, 21-22, 27) has it. As we proclaim in response to the Psalm (Ps 14:2-5. R. v.1) "The just will live in the presence of the Lord".

Jesus was a faithful Jew. He read the Torah and prayed the Psalms at home and in the synagogue. Jesus does not reject the Law but emphasises it is the light that shows us the way in dark times. We can't denounce the behaviour of the Pharisees while ignoring how many of us Christians today, in the name of tradition, share the same attitudes: wanting to build walls to make clear who are acceptable and those who are outside. For Jesus everything goes back to the heart. No amount of external ritual is of any use if it obscures or distorts the primary truth that holiness is ultimately about conversion of heart.

Social Justice Statement "Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World"

The Australian Catholic Bishops have issued "a comprehensive call to action for Catholics and all people of goodwill to engage in peace building through truth-telling, dialogue, and practical initiatives. It frames peace as a realistic and attainable goal, grounded in the teachings of the Gospel and the example of Jesus Christ. By addressing both global and local conflicts, the statement encourages a collective effort towards a peaceful world, rooted in the values espoused by the Catholic faith."

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

SOCIAL JUSTICE STATEMENT 2024-2025 Truth & Peace : A Gospel Word in a Violent World

Australia's Catholic bishops say peace is possible if people commit to speaking the truth and redouble efforts to end war. The Australian Catholic Bishops Conference has released the Social Justice Statement, entitled Truth and Peace: A Gospel Word in a Violent World.



The statement examines rising tensions

around the world, the nature of the truth, the spread of misinformation and disinformation, the arms race, domestic cohesion, the need for dialogue and education for peace.

Every year, the bishops seek to make a substantive comment on a key social issue and this year the focus is on the promotion of peace and the need for truth in public life.
