Dear sisters and brothers,

Collect prayer: Almighty ever living God, increase our faith, hope and charity, and make us love what you command, so that we may merit what you promise. This collect is from 537 after the lifting of the Ostrogoth siege of Rome. It asks for the gifts needed for eternal life. Firstly, an increase of living faith, hope and love which are the foundation of Christian living and our relationship with God, on which is built mutual forgiveness, compassion for others and love in action. This way of living reaches its fulfilment in the eternal life of heaven.

In the **Gospel**, Jesus comes to Jericho the last town on his long journey with the disciples to Jerusalem. This began with the healing of a blind man (Mk 8:22-26) and now ends with the healing of Bartimaeus, a blind beggar at the city gate of Jericho (Mk 10:46-52). Mark uses blindness as a symbol of the spiritual blindness of the disciples on the long journey. Bartimaeus asks that he may see. But spiritually he already sees as he understands who Jesus is. The irony is that this annoying beggar has spiritual sight whereas the disciples even after their long journey with him do not. He addresses Jesus as rabbouni, a deferential form of rabbi (my dear teacher). Jesus applauds the faith he sees in this man. Jesus says 'Your trusting faith has given you life'. It is an echo of Isaiah 35:4-5: He will come and save you. Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. Bartimaeus, is a surprising model of our discipleship and faith. The disciples because they are stuck in their understanding of the Messiah are not open to understand the newness that Jesus reveals and what his mission is.

### Synod on Synodality

The Synod on Synodality will conclude this Sunday. We await the final document and then over the next few years we can expect to see the first fruits of the Synod and those that follow. Please pray for Pope Francis and all involved in the implementation of the Synod.

Participants in Rome testify to the value of their ongoing "Conversations in the Spirit" and the building up of trust and relationships. Amidst such a diverse gathering of delegates, from diverse cultures, there has grown a profound sense of unity. The hope is that this methodology of encounter, dialogue, and discernment will be put into practice in all parts of our global church, including here in Perth and, indeed, in Morley.

This is not to say there have been no lively discussions and disagreements. Marist Brother Mark O'Connor recalls the Aussie film Strictly Ballroom in which there is an epic struggle. The organisers knew only one model of 'ballroom dancing'. Their slogan was: "No new steps". A young couple, however, showed in their dancing, that "new steps" were actually possible. Likewise, in the Church there is a similar debate about what, if any, 'new steps' in our 'dance' are possible or, indeed, needed. What is at stake in the Church, of course, is something much more important than 'new steps'. It is the Gospel itself being preached and understood in different cultures and languages. The Gospel doesn't change but how it is expressed develops over time. If we deeply listen to one another we can begin to appreciate our deeper unity. Synodality goes back to the very origins of the Church. I believe its recovery is vital for the future of our Church.
