Dear sisters and brothers,


Collect Prayer: Almighty and merciful God, graciously keep us from all adversity, so that, unhindered in mind and body alike, we may pursue in freedom of heart the things that are yours. The collect sets our existence on earth within a vivid struggle against sin, death and evil forces. When God frees us from sin, temptation and the power of evil we live with inner harmony and spiritual freedom.

All Scripture needs to be interpreted. What is the message of our Gospel today? We have all heard interpretations of today's Gospel (Mk 12:38-44) as praise of the virtuous widow who gives all she has to pay the relatively small Temple tax. She now has to rely solely on God's Providence. Jesus himself praises her attitude in contrast with that of the ostentatious donations of the rich and privileged. With her, there is no grandstanding. She doesn't need an audience or recognition. The First Reading (1 Kgs 17:10-16) links in with the Gospel. A pagan woman takes the word of Elijah relying completely on God in order to give hospitality to Elijah while she and her son face starvation. God rewards her trust "Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied". Trusting faith is the channel through which the generosity and power of God flow into the world.

However, there is another, somewhat surprising, interpretation of today's Gospel. In the immediately preceding verses Jesus denounces the scribes for taking the places of honour at banquets (where they will be very well fed), while 'swallowing the property of widows'. Then immediately after this scene he speaks of the destruction of the Temple to which the widow contributes all she has. Jesus sees religious law, as interpreted by the scribes, inducing 'little ones' to contribute to the treasury far more than they can afford. Are Jesus' words of praise for the widow also a denunciation of this type of religion?

This incident provides the opportunity for Jesus to speak about the Temple's destruction. The Temple will cease to be the place of atonement. Its place is taken by the sacrifice of Jesus' own life through the shedding of his blood on the cross (Mk 10:45; 14:24). **The Second Reading** (Hebrews 9:24-28) stresses the assurance of Christ's salvific work for the removal of sin since the sacrifice he offered was that of his own life on the cross.

We don't have to choose just one of these understandings of the Gospel. We can admire the widow's generosity and faith while remaining critical of the religious system that drove her to such extremes. The Gospel story is a warning today about the way any religion, including our own, falsely interpreted and promoted, can serve to oppress rather than liberate the poor and vulnerable. —Blessings, Greg
