Dear sisters and brothers,

Collect *God our Father, who, by sending into the world the Word of truth and the Spirit of sanctification made known to the human race your wondrous mystery, grant us, we pray, that in professing the true faith, we may acknowledge the Trinity of eternal glory and adore your Unity, powerful in majesty.* The feast of the Trinity was first celebrated early in the second millennium. Our current prayer was crafted after Vatican II. It identifies the divine Trinity as Father, Word and Spirit. God's self-revelation comes through the incarnation of the Word and the gift of the Holy Spirit. The nature of God as revealed in the Paschal mystery and the power of the Spirit in our midst.

In the **Gospel** (John 16:12-15) Jesus looks to the future when he will no longer be physically present to the disciples. He assures them that their privileged sharing in the intimacy of the relationship between himself and the Father will not cease but continue through the gift of the Spirit. The 'truth' which the Spirit communicates is ultimately the revelation that 'God is love' (1 John 4:7, 16).



This icon by Andrei Rublev (1360-1430) offers a visual gateway to meditation on the Trinity. There are three angels sitting on the altar, each holding exactly the same sceptres of power, each exactly the same in facial aspects and posture, each with the same halo around their heads, but each having particular attributes. The angels refer to the visitation of God to Abraham at the oaks of Mamre (Gen 18), where they tell him that Sarah will have a son. The angel on the left is the Creator, the invisible God who calls all things into being. The angel in the middle is Christ, he holds two fingers on the table indicating that he is both fully human and fully divine. The angel on the right is the Holy Spirit. The chalice at the centre of the altar holds the blood of the new covenant. They are one in relationships of equality, difference and mutuality. We, too, are always being loved, loving and transmitting that divine love.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON

Since you are children of God,
God has sent into your hearts

Have you thought? Spoken through the prophets

One Creedal statement about the
Holy Spirit is that 'He has spoken
through the prophets'. This state-
ment of Christian belief is to reaf-
firm that the Spirit has played a
role throughout human history
and did not 'come into being' at
Pentecost. In fact, a translation of
the opening lines of Genesis reads,
'and the Spirit of God hovered
over the waters'. Although the Old
Testament emphasises God the
Creator, or the Father, the gospels
emphasise the role of Jesus, the
Son and the New Testament writ-
ings emphasise the work of the
Spirit, all three expressions of
God's loving presence are beyond
the limits of time and place.
