Dear sisters and brothers,

Today's Collect: *O God, who by the mystery of today's great feast sanctify your whole Church in every people and nation, pour out, we pray, the gifts of the Holy Spirit across the face of the earth and, with the divine grace that was at work when the Gospel was first proclaimed, fill now once more the hearts of believers.* Our prayer to God is that the Holy Spirit renew the hearts of the baptised and fill them with the divine love and energy.

Our Scripture readings bring out the early Church's sense of being a community created, energised and equipped for ministry by the Spirit of God.

In the **First Reading** (Acts 2:1-11) Luke depicts the imparting of the Spirit upon the Church at the Jewish feast of Pentecost fifty days (seven weeks) after Passover. This feast involved a pilgrimage to Jerusalem to give thanks for the completion of the grain harvest and to celebrate the gift of the land. People from many regions hear the testimony of the Spirit-filled apostles each in their own language. These are people from the Jewish diaspora who are a foretaste of the universal mission of the Church. The Church will speak in many languages to communicate the essential message of 'the marvels of God'. The tongues of fire are the diverse languages (tongues) of people. Fire comes from God to rest on the individuals chosen to continue the mission of Jesus firstly in Jerusalem and then to the ends of the earth and to the end of time.

The **Second Reading**, (Rom 8:8-17) speaks of the personal experience of the Spirit. To live 'according to the flesh' is to live selfishly, placing ourselves at the centre of existence. To live 'according to the Spirit' is to allow the utterly unselfish love of Christ to take over our life and set us on the path to God's eternal life. For Paul the Spirit is the continuing influence in human lives of the transforming power of the risen Lord. The Spirit also communicates a sense of intimacy with God as his sons and daughters in union with Christ. The Spirit impels us to address God as 'Abba' Father, (Rom 8:15; Gal 4:6) – a sure testimony that they now shared the intimacy and closeness of Jesus' relationship to God. This banishes fear and the brings us the hope of sharing Christ's risen life.

The **Gospel** (Jn 20:19-23) locates the imparting of the Spirit with the resurrection of the Lord. So, it is on the evening of 'the first day of the week' (i.e. the day of the Resurrection) that Jesus appears to the frightened and pathetic disciples, makes clear his identity, and imparts to them the 'Peace' that overcomes their fear. He is the 'Lamb who takes away the sins of the Lord' (1:29, 36; 19:36). He gives the Spirit to empower them to take up the mission of liberation and reconciliation that Jesus received from the Father. The Spirit creates communion with God, unity with our fellow Christians and empowers us for mission.

In this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, we pray: Come, Holy Spirit, pour out your gifts across the face of the whole earth, renew our hearts and minds and unite in your love all who believe in Christ!

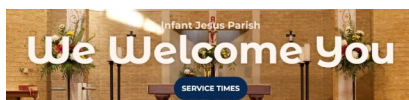
4. Liturgical Ministry, Readers and Listeners

The Spirit of the Lord has filled the whole world

FIRST READING Acts 2:1-11

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because all heard them speaking in their own languages. Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and converts, Cretans and Arabs - in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power."

SECOND READING Rom 8:8-17

Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; you are in the Spirit, since the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, though the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of God who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you.

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh- for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.

LIVING THE GOSPEL

Come, Holy Spirit

'Come, Holy Spirit', or its Latin, *Veni Sancte Spiritus*, has become the basis of countless prayers and hymns over many hundreds of years. To this day, it remains a powerful invocation that can be used in prayer or meditation. Three simple words convey a wealth of meaning. The invitation for the Spirit to 'Come' indicates recognition of the need for the Spirit's intervention and openness to accept the guidance that the Spirit brings. It is a powerful, simple prayer that can be used at the outset of any significant undertaking or whenever you find yourself in need of inspiration.
