God bless you and all your family

Dear sisters and brothers,

Collect *O God, who in the abasement of your Son have raised up a fallen world, fill your faithful with holy joy, for on those you have rescued from slavery to sin you bestow eternal gladness.* The collect is a petition for joy since Christ's humble self-offering has raised up a fallen world and, indeed, all creation. Slavery to sin is contrasted with holy freedom and joy which is completed in heaven. This joy is traditionally associated with worship and devotion. May our celebrations be coloured by joy!

In Luke's **Gospel** (9:1-6) Jesus sends out the Twelve on mission. Then, today (Lk 10:1-12, 17-20) he sends out 72 others in pairs. For Jesus, all believers, not just the Twelve, are missionaries: our first task is to proclaim the good news of God's unconditional offer of reconciliation (Luke 4:16-21) and the gift of messianic 'peace'. There is a sense of urgency. They are to travel light- in openness and freedom. The missionaries go out lightly clad, unprotected, taking no provisions for the journey. They will have to run the risk of relying entirely on the hospitality they are given. Jesus says that where his people meet rejection they are to simply move on and not beat themselves up or feel they have failed. Simply move on. Their combat is with spiritual forces against which no amount of earthly protection will be of use. There will be surprises on their journey, both welcome and unpleasant, but the disciples are to be grateful in all situations and attentive to the needs of all.

When the disciples return (Lk 10: 17-20) they are thrilled at the effect they have had. Jesus reminds them that this victory is not their doing but the work of God. For this they should rejoice! Because of their faithfulness to God's mission their names are written in heaven.

That all Catholics are called to be witnesses and to be part of the Church's life and mission is a major theme given to us in recent years by our popes since Vatican II.

I will say thank you and good-bye at the annual parish BBQ for the Australia Day holiday in January 2026. It is my intention to return to our Carmelite priory outside Sydney.

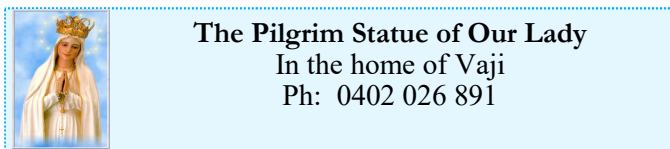

Your merciful love, O God, we have received in the midst of your temple. Your praise, O God, like your name, reaches the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with saving justice.

FIRST READING Isa 66:10-14

GOSPEL Lk 10:1-12, 17-20

The Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. "Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. "Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.' But whenever you enter a town and they

do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near.' I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town."

The seventy returned with joy, saying, "Lord, in your name even the demons submit to us!" Jesus said to them, "I watched Satan fall from heaven like a flash of lightning. See, I have given you authority to tread on snakes and scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy; and nothing will hurt you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."✠

Living the gospel

Discipleship

Today's gospel passage immediately follows the passage used last week that spelt out the difficulties of discipleship. Having explained how hard it is to be a disciple, Jesus sends his followers out to 'have a go' at being a disciple. When they come back successful he tells them not to be boastful or proud at their achievements but rather to be happy that their "names are written in heaven". In other words, anything they accomplished was because they were 'known' by God and that God was working through them. Disciples make themselves 'known' to God and God works through them to accomplish great things!
