Dear Parishioners,

Just this week Fr Gerard and I visited the Year 4s who have been learning about the Rosary. Each student handmade a rosary bracelet, which was blessed during this week's class visit (I have never seen so many students so excited to have a blessing; they were basically jumping up and down as I sprinkled holy water on them and their rosary!). It was a rather delightful experience; it was also very encouraging to hear how their teachers, Mr Daniel Silla and Ms Monica D'Addario, have been leading the students in the Rosary every morning.

Above all, the Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous, and Glorious Mysteries reveal the Mystery of Jesus. As a student rightly answered when asked, the Rosary helps us walk with Mary who leads us ever closer to Jesus. When we walk with Jesus and Mary in our *joys* and *sorrows*, we can experience how the darkness of our lives can be *illuminated*, and, with God's grace, we ourselves become transfigured to share in the *glory* of God. The more we allow Jesus and Mary into every moment of our lives, the more we can share in the grace of transformation.

As we come to the end of May – a month traditionally dedicated to our Lady – it is wonderful to reflect how the Rosary can help in every season of our lives as we celebrate the different Liturgical Seasons of the Church. The Mysteries of the Rosary roughly correspond to the Liturgical Seasons: the Joyful with Advent and Christmas; the Luminous with Ordinary Time; the Sorrowful with Lent; and the Glorious Mysteries with Easter.

As you may recall, Easter begins with the celebration of the Resurrection (the First Glorious Mystery) and is divided into two unequal parts by the Ascension (the Second Glorious Mystery). The Easter Season formally concludes with the Solemnity of Pentecost (the Third Glorious Mystery; our feast this Sunday). Interestingly, whilst the last two Glorious Mysteries, which are Marian in nature, are not celebrated in Easter, a deeper reflection reveals their substantial link to Easter.

At the Assumption (the Fourth Glorious Mystery), Our Lady shares – body and soul – in the tremendous grace of Her Son's Ascension. The Assumption and the Ascension are intimately linked! Likewise, Mary's coronation as Queen of Heaven and Earth (the Fifth Glorious Mystery) is a share in Her Son's kingship and eternal reign. Indeed, these Marian Mysteries orientate us to our ultimate destiny insofar as we are willing to participate in God's transforming grace. Most importantly, our transformation can only proceed *through* the Holy Spirit.

It is the Holy Spirit, poured out so generously at Pentecost, that constitutes the Church, confects the Eucharist and all the Sacraments, and transforms us to bear a purer image and likeness of God. The Holy Spirit is so very necessary if the graces of Advent, Christmas, and Lent are to culminate in the central grace of Easter: the resurrection and, therefore, our entry into eternal life.

This Solemnity of Pentecost, may we all indeed seek to be transformed by the Spirit as we use His sevenfold Gifts to empower us in our daily life. May we truly walk humbly with Jesus and Mary in the Spirit that we may indeed bear the fruits of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity.

FIRST READING:

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose.

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.
